WHAT IS A CHINESE AUCTION? HOW DOES IT WORK?

A Chinese auction is more like a raffle than an auction. Each participant can purchase **GOLDENROD** tickets with which to “bid” on a specific prize. The “bid” is higher based on the number of tickets you put in any one “Chinese food” container. The more tickets with your number, the higher the chances of winning. Tickets are sold for **\$20 for 25 tickets**. Each of the 25 tickets on a sheet has the same number, so you only need to hold on to the large ticket to check when the numbers are called. There is a door prize ticket as well, which you should deposit in the door prize container. Obviously, the more ticket sheets you buy, the higher your chances of winning.

There are also **Special Raffle Prizes** which require a **RED ticket (3 for \$10)**.

The Kiwanis International Story

Kiwanis was founded in Detroit, Michigan, January 21, 1915 by professional organizer Allen Browne. The first Kiwanian was a merchant tailor named Joseph Prance. The original name was "The Benevolent Order of Brothers," and its purpose was the mutual exchange of preferred treatment in professional and business dealings. Within a year, the name had been changed to "Kiwanis," taken from a Native American term "Nun Keewanis" which loosely means "Self Expression." It had become obvious that the original purpose lacked appeal for many members. The purpose of the organization thus became "community service," a humanitarian concept from which Kiwanis has never deviated.

While 1937 saw unemployment drop to 14.3%, down 6.7% from the previous year, the changing politics of Europe and the human tragedy of the Hindenburg explosion were on the minds of many. As Americans coped with this changing world, Judy Garland told "Dear Mr. Gable" that he made her love him, the Golden Gate Bridge opened, FDR was inaugurated for the second time, "Old Age Insurance Benefits" was created and Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs filled movie theatres and buoyed the hearts of Americans.

The 1930s expanded the role of government, but government alone would never be enough. A group of true visionaries understood that Hicksville deserved a Kiwanis Club. With the support of the Kiwanis Club of Freeport, the Hicksville Club became a reality when Kiwanis International issued the formal charter on June 20, 1937. Hicksville became the third Long Island club, following Hempstead (1) and Freeport (2).

On July 7, 1987 Kiwanis International Convention delegates voted to extend membership to women, finally recognizing the valuable contributions that women make to our society and the contributions they could make to Kiwanis service to children. By the end of the 1987-88 administrative year, more than 8,500 women had joined the ranks of Kiwanis worldwide. On this, the 25th Anniversary of Women in Kiwanis, we applaud the service of two women who joined us in 1987 - Constance Clarke and Beth Dalton-Costello.

We salute the visionaries who created Kiwanis International and those who created the Hicksville Club - we are forever in your debt.

RAZVAN CONSTANTINESCU



All of our members agree that without Razvan – his brain, his brawn and his optimism – we would not be the club we are today. He is very generous with his time as well as his spirit and exemplifies the Kiwanis object of fellowship. His never-faltering commitment to his Kiwanis work, and his drive to make the world a better place, mark him as a very special member of our club. Just like the person for who the Spirit of Giving Award is named, Razvan always is there to help work it out, convinced that together we can do great things and that little is impossible if we keep a good thought and remember the goal. And also, like Nick Brigandi, Razvan is extraordinarily kind. A kindness born of strength and fortitude and hopefulness.

Born and raised in Communist Romania, Razvan always dreamed of coming to America. The hardships of an authoritarian regime only prepared him for his new life in the States. Since he was a child, he was attracted to the exact sciences, especially math, which came naturally to him. Although he initially wanted to become a mechanical engineer, he switched to information systems as he discovered computers when Romania became a democratic country and opened up in 1989. He worked several jobs using computers, such as payroll for a small construction company and desktop publishing for a major Romanian newspaper.

After a few years and many attempts to leave Romania, he and his wife, Ozana, were finally able to come to the US in 1995. The first few years were hard, integrating into the new culture and society, the birth of their two children, Victoria and Michael, and settling in their new life. During the first five years working in the quality control, mechanical field, Razvan was able to focus more on computers, getting a degree in Computer Programming and then involved in computer hardware, software, networking, development, design, and training. For the last 20 years he's been working for a major US bank in the field of data analytics, databases and reporting.

One “funny” thing he remembers as a child from his native country was his school forcing all students to participate in the so-called “patriotic volunteering,” which was more mandatory than optional. As he settled in his new country and new job, he also started looking to find some meaningful volunteer opportunities, his chance to help others and give back. Although he volunteered for some non-profits and events, nothing truly connected with him. That changed in 2013 when his daughter, Victoria was awarded the “William F. and Carol V. Saueracker” scholarship from the Kiwanis Foundation of Hicksville. He found in Kiwanis not only the perfect local volunteer organization, but also made many friends that later became a second family. As the club secretary, he manages the official website and social media accounts, meeting minutes and reporting, as well as being involved in most of the club and foundation events and programs.

Kiwanis is not Razvan's only outlet. He is also a member of the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) in Nassau County, a federally funded, community-based volunteer program that provides training and on-going education to better prepare communities and individuals to respond to emergency and disaster situations.

This commitment to giving back is also what his family is about. Both his wife and daughter became RNs, helping those in need, and his son just completed his Master degree in Education – again a commitment to improving the lives of others.

Phil has been a member of our Kiwanis Club since 2007 and has served as secretary, president-elect and president. He is currently the immediate past president.

While always committed to helping others and giving back to his community, being part of Kiwanis has enabled him to give back on an even greater scale. From fund raising in the form of garage sales or Luck of the Irish lottery sales, Christmas in July food drives to support local pantries, to serving the community as a whole, he has embraced the Kiwanis ideals of helping children. For many years Phil has chaired our birthday party program for needy children in Hicksville.

Whatever the activity, he is in it 100%, no ifs, ands or buts.

Since 2007, he has funded a scholarship for a graduating Hicksville High School senior entering a field of health care. He is committed to our Kiwanis work and we look forward to working with him for many years to come.

So, who is this Kiwanis super-star?

Philip M Tornatore, DDS was born in February 1960, first of two sons of Lucy and Felix and raised in Whitestone, Queens. As a child he developed a love for math and science which he attributes to “chewing on cardboard jigsaw puzzles at a very young age.” You can’t make this stuff up.

Phil graduated from Saint Francis Prep High School and obtained his Bachelor of Arts from New York University in mathematics and computer science. He obtained his Doctorate of Dental Surgery from New York University College of Dentistry in 1986, graduating in the top ten percent of his class. He completed his training in June of 1987 with a one-year general practice residency at Staten Island Hospital.

In June of 1987, he interviewed at the office of Stanley N. Turetzky, DDS on Jerusalem Avenue in Hicksville and accepted a position as an associate dentist thus beginning his Hicksville experience. As he is often heard to say, “Being from Queens, I had no idea where Hicksville was, I came and I never left.” He purchased Dr. Turetzky’s practice in July of 1992 and moved to his current location at 404 Jerusalem Avenue in March of 1999. This past June Dr. Phil celebrated 35 years practicing dentistry in Hicksville.

Phil didn’t just join our Kiwanis Club, he brought with him a group of our best supporters – Lucy, his mom; Felix, his dad; Jo, his godmother; and his children Erin, Ryan and Megan. While President Ed always refers to him as “Dentist to the Stars,” clearly Phil is a STAR in all he undertakes.

While not yet a member of The Kiwanis Club of Hicksville, Mrs. Rafaelides is no stranger to our club members. She continues to be an essential part of our Scholarship Program, our Middle School Youth Awards Recognition, as well as our joint program to assist family at Thanksgiving time. While she tells us “I am thankful for the support that I have received from The Kiwanis Foundation of Hicksville, Inc.,” we are the truly thankful, grateful and blessed ones.

We are not the only ones to recognize this extraordinary woman. Effie has been recognized three times at Hicksville's Founders Day, including once as the district honoree and received the prestigious Nassau BOCES Education Partner Award.

Clearly, children are Effie's life-focus - not only her own 16 year old daughter, Angelica - but all the children of Hicksville School District. She has been working with children and families for over thirty years. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from St. John's University and a Master of Social Work from Adelphi University. She has a strong background in chemical dependency treatment, clinical and school social work. She is entering her twenty-second year at Hicksville Public Schools, seventeen in guidance supervision. Prior to her administrative position, she was the high school social worker.

As the Guidance Supervisor for Hicksville Schools, she assisted in designing several critical programs to promote increased student achievement. With the district's former Supervisor of World Languages, Lisa Estrada, she developed the *Parent-Student University* (PSU) connecting the parents of English Language Learners (ELLs) with what is happening in their schools. She was also able to add four bilingual guidance counselors to better support ELLs at the elementary, middle and high school levels. In the middle school she created a *Peer Mentoring Academy* (PMA) that matches academically struggling middle school students with high school-aged tutors and role models. In partnership with Nassau BOCES, she spearheaded the committee that created the *Working to Inspire, Nurture, Grow and Succeed* (WINGS) program, which provides at-risk students with a non-traditional classroom setting during after-school hours to help them become more successful by increasing student academic performance and attendance resulting in graduation. This was accomplished with the support of central administration, high school administrators and parents. In collaboration with the school counseling team and fellow administrators, Effie also brought the web-based, cross-curricular career exploration program *Naviance* to Hicksville. She is also committed to promoting Mindfulness and Social Emotional Learning across the district, to calm the mind and body, reduce stress, and increase attention spans.

Perhaps Effie's own words are the best - “I believe as educators, we can and should connect with, embrace and engage all children. Through the words of Mother Teresa, “Let us always meet each other with a smile, for the smile is the beginning of love. With a smile, and through a strong work effort, perseverance, determination and resilience, anyone can achieve any goal which is worthwhile. My parents taught me this at a very young age. I believe this to be true.”

We must thank Effie's mom, Angela, and her late father for instilling in her an incredible work ethic and generosity of spirit; we thank her husband Peter and daughter Angelica for sharing her with us, for what must often seem like way-too-many hours a day; for giving her the love and support to fuel her “*EverReady Bunny*” energy and for also serving as her focus and driving force to “make the world a better place, one child, one community at a time.”
